

CHESS'N MATH ASSOCIATION

The Chess'n Math Association (CMA) is Canada's National Scholastic Chess Organization. As a non-profit organization, our mission is to provide youngsters with the opportunities and resources necessary for learning and developing their chess playing abilities in a fun and disciplined environment. CMA, a world leader in the field, offers many services for young people including tournaments, a National scholastic rating system, lessons, a magazine, chess day camps, and more. We also organize National events such as the Canadian Chess Challenge, and sponsor our top Canadian talents. The CMA has coordinators in every province and has 3 branches in Montreal, Ottawa and Toronto.

What does Chess have to do with Math? As a component of the math program "Challenging Mathematics", chess is used as a tool to develop problem-solving skills and concentration. This emphasis on problem-solving and concentration helps children develop logical thought processes.

CHESS LESSONS

Instructors use a curriculum program for children that has been developed by our leading instructors over the decades. The program has 9 levels from Pawn Level to Advanced. Each lesson is followed by a practice period which allows the instructor to look over areas of difficulty with the students on an individual basis. Exercise sheets are given at the end of each lesson to allow the student to review what was taught in class. The size of the group is kept small in order to provide quality instruction. Certificates, indicating the child's understanding of the game, are awarded at the end of the course.

At the first stages of a youngster's development, group lessons are the most beneficial. The Chess'n

CHESS CLUB

Whether you're a beginner or an advanced player, chess clubs are the ideal place to practice chess with other young people who share the same passion. During this activity, players can increase their playing calibre while being supervised and supported by coaches who provide judicious personal advice, theoretical instructions and plenty of practice against different opponents on a regular basis.

RATINGS

A rating is a numerical evaluation of a player's playing strength. The best player in the world, Magnus Carlsen, is rated around 2800. A youngster in grade 1 who has just learned how to play would be rated around 200. A rating goes up and down depending on performance at rated competition. All Chess'n Math tournaments are rated.

It takes approximately 25 games for a rating to accurately reflect the playing strength of a player. Schools should contact us about rating their events. Ratings are updated every Friday on our website www.chess-math.org

TOURNAMENTS

The best way to become a good chess player is to practice. At this stage of development, chess is 90% practice and 10% theory. The best practice is obtained by playing in tournaments. A complete calendar of our scholastic tournaments appears on the reverse side of this sheet. As soon as a player knows how to checkmate, they are strong enough to play in a tournament!

REGULAR TOURNAMENTS

For kids from Kindergarten to CEGEP I. Players with a rating play according to their rating. Those who do not have a rating play against other players in the same grade. The tournaments last around 4 hours. Our regular tournaments are structured in a way so

that children who know how to checkmate will have fun.

Prizes: Medals are given to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place finishers. Special prizes for the 900+ section. Ribbons for all other players.

Online registration: \$30 or \$100 for all 4 regular tournaments of the 2023-2024 season.

Onsite registration takes place between 10:30 and 11:15 am and costs are \$35 or \$115 for all 4 regular tournaments of the 2023-2024 season.

SCHOOL TEAM TOURNAMENTS

These tournaments are very popular because they allow schools to form teams and compete against each other. Each team is made up of 4 players from the same school.

QUALIFICATION TOURNAMENTS

These tournaments give the players an opportunity to qualify for the Quebec Chess Challenge (QCC) which will take place on April 28th, 2024 this year. For the complete list of qualification tournaments, visit our website.

QUEBEC CHESS CHALLENGE

The Quebec Chess Challenge is an opportunity for young people from all over Quebec to participate in the biggest youth tournament of the year.

The winners from each grade from grade 1 to CEGEP 1 will represent Quebec at the Canadian Chess Challenge.

CANADIAN CHESS CHALLENGE

Organized by the Chess'n Math Association, it is the most prestigious competition by school grade in Canada. Only the winners of the provincial championships can qualify. This year, the tournament will be held on May 19th to 20th in New Brunswick.

DAY CAMP

The Chess'n Math Association offers various day camps. Leader in our field, we welcome nearly 1000 players in our day camps every year. Increase your level of play in a fun, disciplined environment.
